FROM YOUR PARK MANAGER

Dear Residents:

The Board has approved the opening of the halls effective February 15th with contingencies as follows:

- Allowing quilters, game room activities, exercise, small dance groups and any other small group activities able to get together with conditions of wearing face coverings and social distancing as best as possible.
- Usage of the premises is at your own risk during this time of COVID. Residents are responsible for cleaning/sanitizing the area prior to leaving the buildings.
- All ROLDI activities are STILL cancelled for the remainder of the season. They will revisit options for the fall.
- Halls will continue to have the same hours of 9:00am
 9:00pm 7 days a week.

Laundry room is **now** open on the weekends as well.

Pool:

- Pool rules will go back to normal, with allowing guests and children (children not permitted between 1-5pm).
- 13-person capacity in the pool still remains the same.
 Please continue to be considerate of your fellow residents.
- NO smoking/vaping or pets allowed within the fenced pool area.

We know you all have been very patient and anxious about the opening of the facilities so we ask that everyone please continue to follow all CDC guidelines and practice safety and care as best as possible.

Water utility project update:

Work continues on Easy Street as they make their way down towards Sun Up. Once this is completed, the next phase of connecting the lines will take place. It is undetermined at this time if the city will continue with the work or they will hire another private contractor.

Work also continues on Idleway towards Sun Up. As of this time, homes from Restful Road to Peaceful Drive on the north side are connected to the main line with new meters installed in front of the homes. Roses Lane to Dream Lane are next to be completed.

If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the office and not the contractors.

A few concerns:

We have had several incidences regarding pedestrians and bike riders almost getting hit by vehicles. PLEASE adhere to the 15mph speed limit and **STOP** signs.

We have also had some incidences regarding bike riders riding at fast speeds and not paying attention to pedestrians and vehicles. For the safety of all in the park, please be aware of everyone around you.

Parking Rules:

Parking on the grass and overnight parking on the street is still a concern in the park. There is NO parking on any grass even for a short period of time. Vehicles have been seen parking overnight on the street. This is not permitted. If you need a copy of the Rules and Regulations please contact the office.

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
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To our valued customers:
