Dear Residents:

Welcome to Spring. Many residents are already leaving for their northern homes. We wish you a safe trip and a great summer. Please remember to check in with the office and complete a departure form so we know you are leaving. Make sure your property is prepared before departure. It is very important to pressure wash home before you leave to avoid any letters being sent over the summer. Trees should be trimmed pre-hurricane, especially if you have coconut trees. It is strongly suggested/recommended that you have your home checked by someone once a week or every two weeks during your time away. This should also include making sure your lawn and weeds are maintained, once again, to avoid any letters being sent. This is your home and we are sure all residents want it staying looking good all year around.

New coupon books have been mailed out. If you have not received yours, please contact the office.

Reminder - fees are due on the first of each month and considered late if received after the 10th. A \$25 late fee will be applied. If you mail or drop off your payments to the office you do not need a coupon. Coupons will be needed if you mail payments to the bank lockbox in Tampa so payments can be property posted to your account. If you are on autopay, you will not receive a coupon book.

There will be a mailing for the 55+ Census to all residents over the summer. Please complete this form and return to the office. This is needed to help Lazy Days keep the 55+ status exemption. Please look out for this mailing.

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BEFORE YOU LEAVE FOR THE SEASON REVIEW YOUR HOME/LOT MAINTENANCE HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

The following is a handy checklist of items to review before you leave for the season. Take a moment to inspect your home and lot to see if any maintenance and preparation is required.

Seasonal residents are reminded that these standards should be met all year-round.

- Home Exterior: Is the outside of home and awnings free of mold, mildew and dirt. Does the home or awnings need painting. <u>Reminder pressure washing is required at least</u> once a year as per the Rules and Regulations.
- Flower Beds & Shrubs: Are your flowerbeds weeded and shrubs trimmed.
- **Trees**: Do your trees need trimming/coconuts removed. Any fruit should be picked up from the ground. Fruit left to rot on the ground attracts rodents.
- **Outdoor Umbrella Clothes Dryer**: Fold umbrella clothes lines before you leave. Due to the high winds and rain during summer storms (possible hurricanes) outdoor umbrella clothes lines should be closed and put away if possible.
- **Gutters**: Make sure gutters are free of debris from vegetation or other items and secure to the home.
- **Skirting**: Is your skirting in place and secure around your entire home.
- Windows: Check for any broken windows or torn screens.
- **Awnings**: Awning should be closed. Strong winds and rain from summer storms can damage awnings left open or damage the inside of your home.
- **Stored Items**: Any items stacked outside of your home or in the carport should be placed in storage. The home site and carport should be free of clutter.
- Lawn: Due to the summer rains, lawns should be maintained once a week during the summer months.
- OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE TO KEEP THEIR HOME MAINTAINED DURING THEIR ABSENCE.


