FROM YOUR PARK MANAGER

Dear Residents,

This has been quite a year for everyone here at Lazy Days. I have only been here since May and have probably seen the worse Mother Nature could throw at us. The residents have been great, coming through in the tough times. We still have much to do on the common areas, plus residents' homes, but based on what everyone has been doing, I have no doubt Lazy Days will be stronger and better than ever.

Here's an update on the repairs to the common areas and the removal of the rest of the debris:

- 1. One of the biggest successes we had was getting FEMA to remove the white pile at the front of community. It took two whole days for the debris to be hauled out. We are thankful that FEMA and Lee County provided this service and the Association didn't have to pay for it. Thanks to our residents who cleaned up the mess left behind and put down the grass seed. I spoke to my contact at FEMA who promises me that we are still on the list to get rid of the large stumps and trees that are in the ponds, one big stump and tree at the pond behind the pool and one at the front pond. He claims it should be within the week.
- 2. There are still many of the common areas that need to be addressed: the street and stop signs, message boards, lights, broken fence posts around the pool, various fences. The Bocce ball court needs to have the surface redone, along with the awnings replaced. These areas are planned for repair or replacement shortly. We have a group of volunteers rebuilding the fence around the storage yard. Again, where would we be without our volunteers? And the group of volunteers who replaced the awnings at the shuffleboard courts, that was amazing.
- 3. Upcoming events the Strawberry Social is scheduled for March 8. That's an event that's hosted by Newby Management and the Lazy Days POA. It sure sounds like a great time.
- 4. And a FYI we've had 53 settlements in the past 12 months. That's a lot of new neighbors. Say hello when you're out and around.

I'd like to thank everyone who has been so supportive as we work our way out of the disaster and get back to normal – and so we don't have to talk about it anymore. If you have issues about your house and would like to discuss it, please do not hesitate to stop in the office.








We send our condolences to Shirley Petite on the passing of husband, Ron, on January 18, 2023.
