FROM YOUR PARK MANAGER

Hello Lazy Days Residents and Happy New Year

I sincerely hope you have all enjoyed a blessed Christmas and New Year celebrations and that we will have an awesome 2024 here at Lazy Days.

One or two small things to ask of you all. First, please keep me informed when you arrive and when you leave the community at the beginning and end of season. This is so that, in the event of an emergency, I can advise Police, Fire department ambulance and any other emergency services of who they need to be looking for. This is especially relevant during Hurricane season but is always important.

Second, ALL renters need to have a CURRENT application on file even if they are repeat renters of your home. We require this for the safety and security of the community and to be compliant with our governing documents. Background checks will NOT be required every year if the same tenant is returning to the same address however, if they have had a break for a year or more OR if they are renting a different home, we need to complete the full application process. The current cost is \$100/adult applicant. All applicants must be on the application. If they have pets, we need pet applications too.

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Remember that the office is officially open until 1:00 p.m. daily and by appointment after that if you need anything. I am in the office most days by 7:00 a.m. so you can catch me on your pre breakfast walk and until at least 3:00 p.m. most days. I am also a notary and am happy to notarize any of your documents at no charge to you.

The two matinees arranged by Ann Gillette are: "Elvis," A Musical Revolution on February 6th, and "Beautiful," Carole King Musical on March 19th.





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
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
