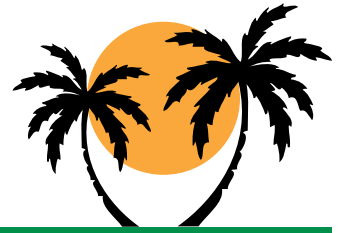

Hello Lazy Days Residents,

Well after 4 - months of being a part of your community I am starting to feel like I am getting the hang of things. Thank you to all who have encouraged me, I appreciate it very much.

Things here are starting to look great. Our trees are getting trimmed, the pool is looking great and many of the homes are now renovated. We will be ready to welcome home all our snow birds over the next few weeks.

We have had several incidents of concern. There have been several car break-ins and at least one owner has had gasoline stolen from the tank. Our community policing officer is working on things and we have a detective investigating. The following are suggestions to discourage this type of theft in our community.

1. LOCK your car and all doors and windows on your home.
2. Motion sensor lights that will come on if someone is close to your car.
3. Doorbell camera or other motion activated cameras.
4. Keep your car keys by the bed so if you hear a noise in the night, you can hit the panic button.

Remember while it is great to let the office know of any incident after the fact, you need to call the Sheriff's Department first. Call 911 if you believe there is an active incident occurring. Call 239-477-1000 for non-emergency incidents.

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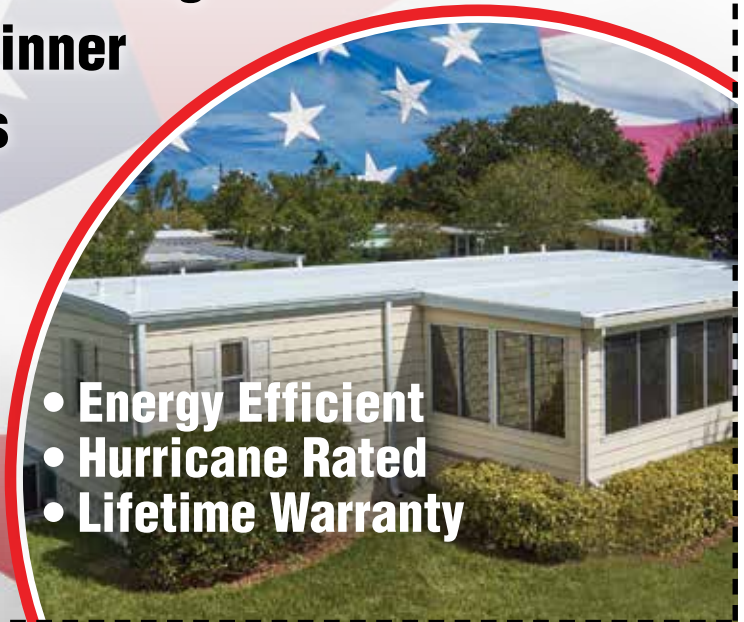


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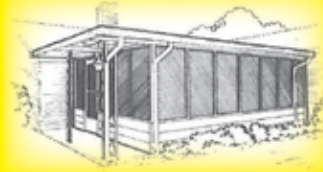

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BEFORE YOU LEAVE FOR THE SEASON REVIEW YOUR HOME/LOT MAINTENANCE HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

The following is a handy checklist of items to review before you leave for the season. Take a moment to inspect your home and lot to see if any maintenance and preparation is required.

Seasonal residents are reminded that these standards should be met all year-round.

- **Home Exterior:** Is the outside of home and awnings free of mold, mildew and dirt. Does the home or awnings need painting. Reminder – pressure washing is required at least once a year as per the Rules and Regulations.
- **Flower Beds & Shrubs:** Are your flowerbeds weeded and shrubs trimmed.
- **Trees:** Do your trees need trimming/coconuts removed. Any fruit should be picked up from the ground. Fruit left to rot on the ground attracts rodents.
- **Outdoor Umbrella Clothes Dryer:** Fold umbrella clothes lines before you leave. Due to the high winds and rain during summer storms (possible hurricanes) outdoor umbrella clothes lines should be closed and put away if possible.
- **Gutters:** Make sure gutters are free of debris from vegetation or other items and secure to the home.
- **Skirting:** Is your skirting in place and secure around your entire home.
- **Windows:** Check for any broken windows or torn screens.
- **Awnings:** Awning should be closed. Strong winds and rain from summer storms can damage awnings left open or damage the inside of your home.
- **Stored Items:** Any items stacked outside of your home or in the carport should be placed in storage. The home site and carport should be free of clutter.
- **Lawn:** Due to the summer rains, lawns should be maintained once a week during the summer months.
- **OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE TO KEEP THEIR HOME MAINTAINED DURING THEIR ABSENCE.**

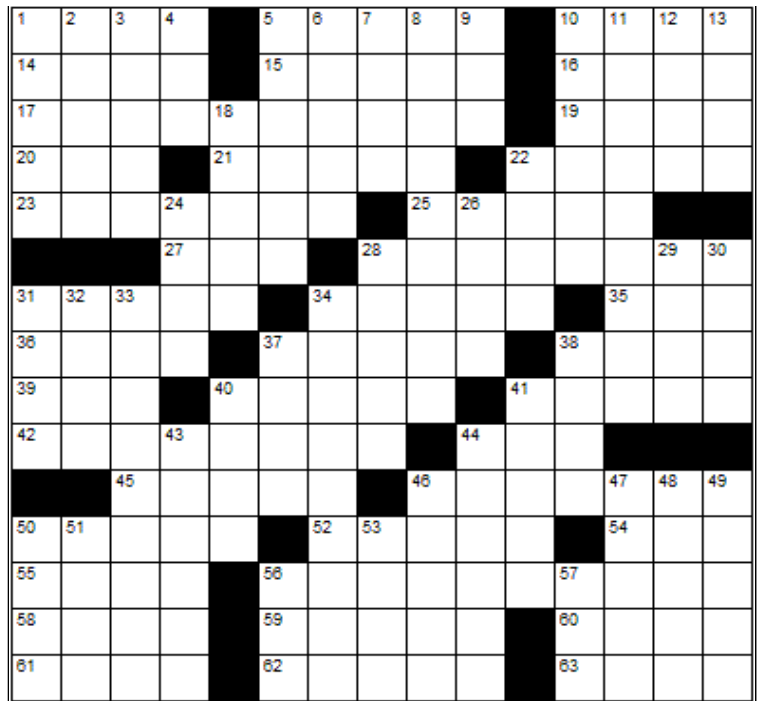
